

HOME ENERGY TIPS + TRICKS

BATHROOM

HEATING WATER IS ONE OF THE BIGGEST HOME ENERGY CONSUMERS, making up 35% of the typical electric bill. Being smart about how you use hot water can mean big savings.

STOP THE LEAKS

A faucet leaking even just one drop per second can amount to over **A THOUSAND GALLONS OF WATER WASTED PER YEAR.**

And if it's a hot water faucet, you're also paying to heat the water you're wasting—so keep those faucets working properly.



UPGRADE YOUR SHOWERHEAD

Upgrade to a **HIGH EFFICIENCY, LOW FLOW** showerhead. You'll still get good water pressure but without the waste.

DON'T OVERHEAT

Turn down the temperature of your water heater to the warm setting (120°F) so that you can take that hot shower without the scalding water.



TAKE SHORTER SHOWERS

Even shortening your daily shower by a few minutes can show up as **SAVINGS ON YOUR ELECTRIC BILL.**
